

**Sarah Banks** is Professor in the School of Applied Social Sciences at Durham University, UK. She is a qualified social worker, has practised as a community development worker and currently teaches on professional qualifying programmes in community and youth work and social work. She initiated the European Social Ethics Project (a working group of FESET), is founding co-editor of the journal, *Ethics and Social Welfare*, and has written extensively on professional ethics, including: *Ethics, Accountability and the Social Professions* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2004) and *Ethics and Values in Social Work* (3rd edition, Palgrave Macmillan, 2006). She has edited books on *Ethical Issues in Youth Work* (Routledge, 1999), *Teaching Practical Ethics for the Social Professions* (FESET, 2003) and *Managing Community Practice* (The Policy Press, 2003). Her two most recent books are: *Critical Community Practice* (The Policy Press, 2007, co-authored with Hugh Butcher and Paul Henderson) and *Ethics in Professional Life: Virtues for Health and Social Care* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2008, co-authored with Ann Gallagher). She has been actively involved in developing statements of ethical principles for the English National Youth Agency and the International Association of Social Workers. She is currently developing the use of Socratic dialogue in research to explore the place of 'integrity', 'vocation' and passion in professional practice.

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
