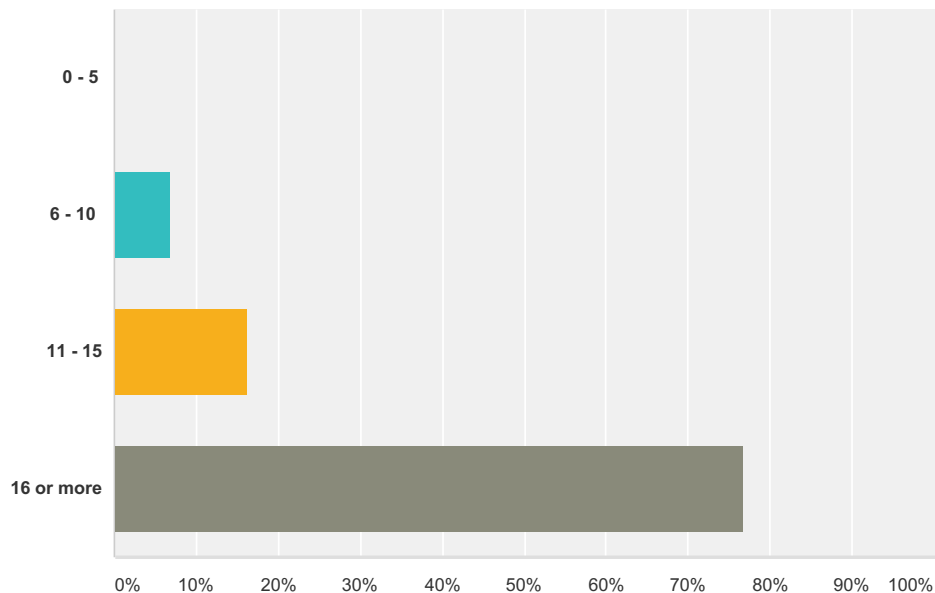

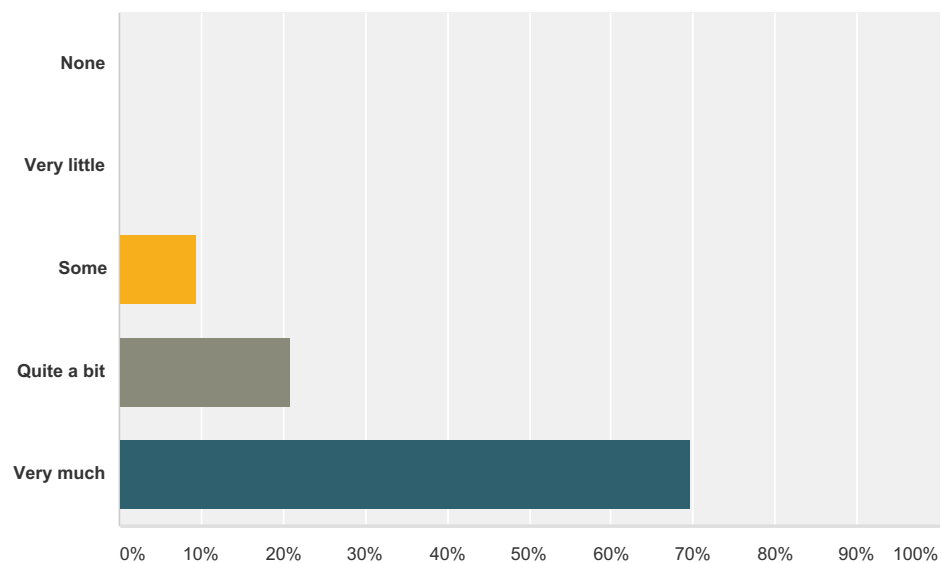

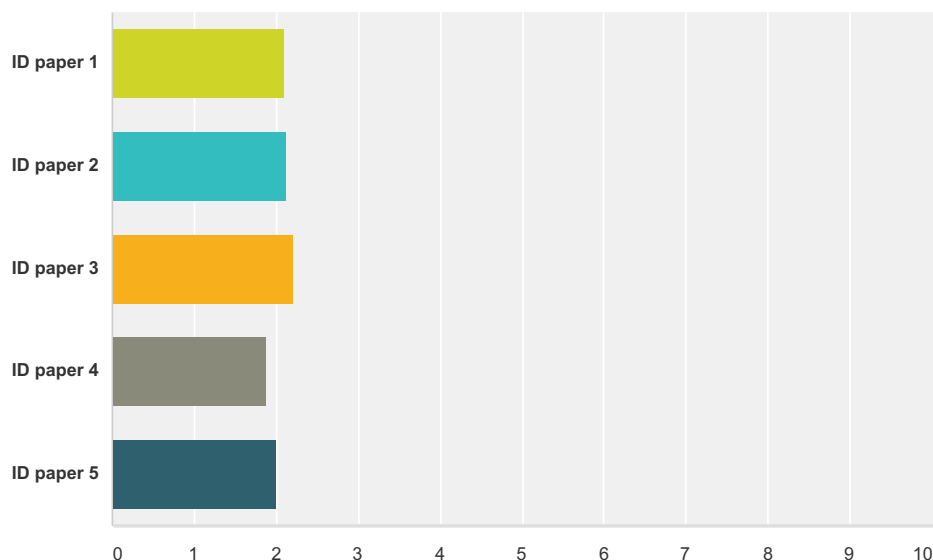

Q9 b) Regarding the four macro themes used as general conceptual framework at the conference, can you please indicate the contribution each paper provided to these topics?

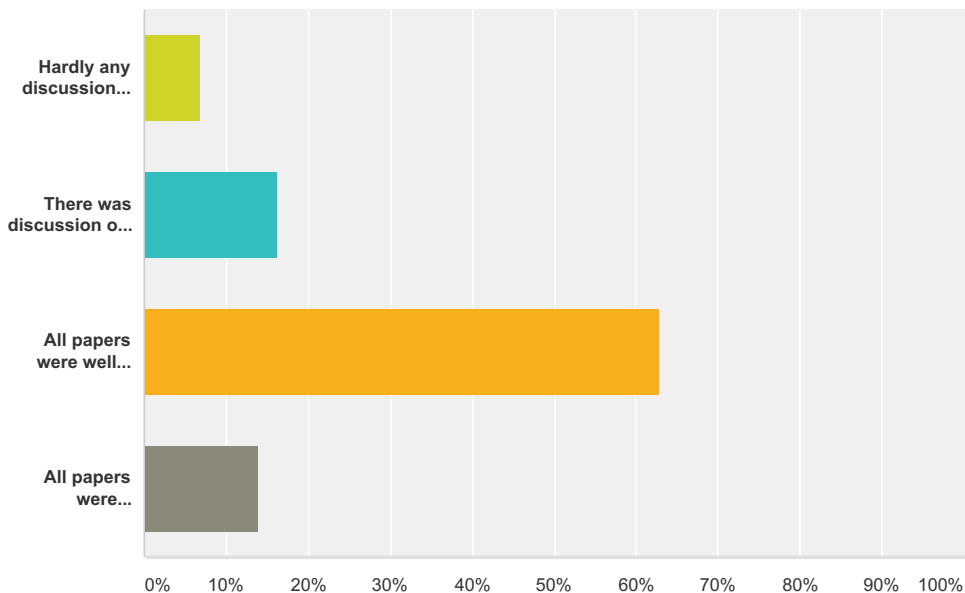

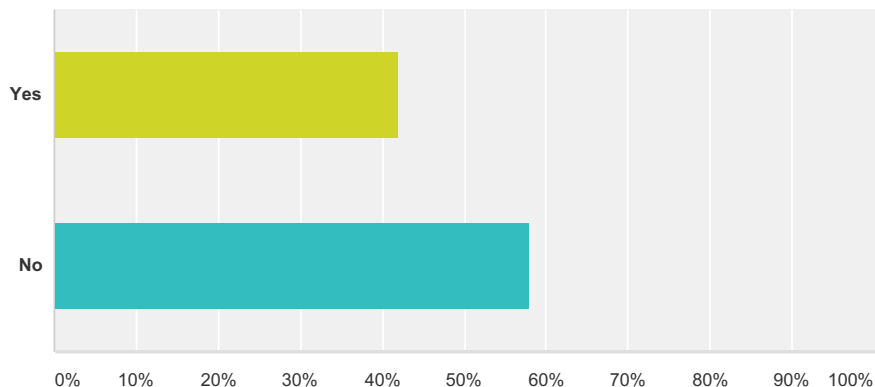

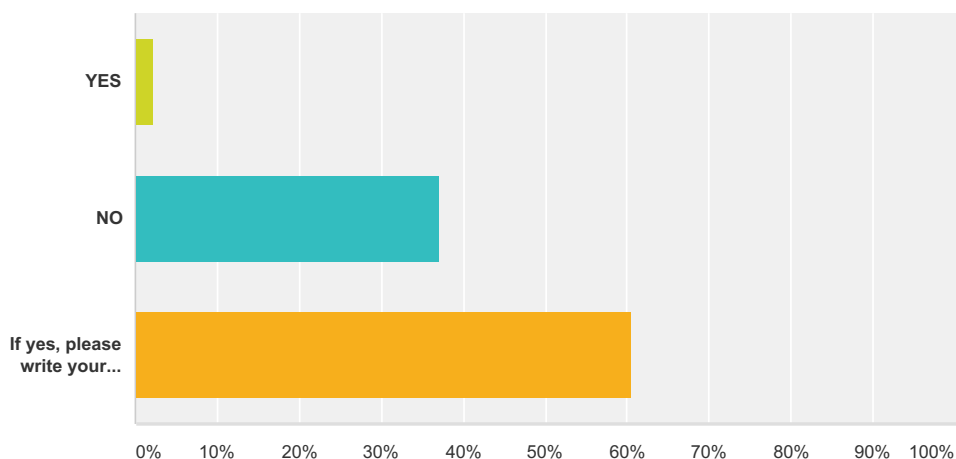
